

# HANGING LIGHT GLOBES

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## Supplies:

- 1 roll chicken wire or hex netting, 2' foot wide, 1" mesh (available at most home & garden stores)
- 2 strands mini-lights, color of your choice, 100 bulbs each
- 1 pair wire cutters
- 1 pair work gloves
- 1 interior/exterior electric extension cord

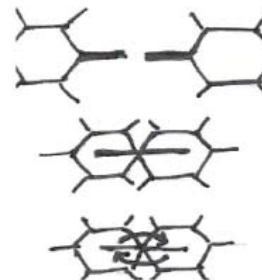
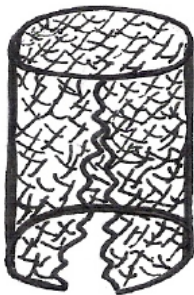
## Directions: (we recommend that you use work gloves while handling wire)



Cut a 45" inch length from the wire mesh roll.



Shape 45"x24" mesh sheet into a cylinder and secure it by twisting together the cut wire ends of the netting.



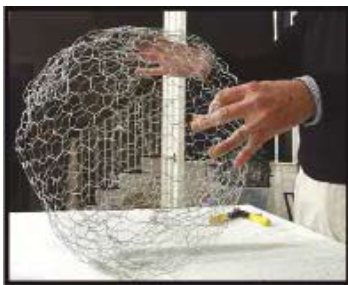
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*Directions:* (continued)



To make a sphere shape, start by bending 5-6" sections at the ends over one another. You will first have something that looks like a rough rectangle.



Mold the shape by mashing the ends until you have created a sphere. Don't expect a perfect round circle; the lights will hide any imperfections!



Tie the female end of first mini-lights strand to the top of the ball. Wind the lights taught around the ball in an even pattern, like winding a ball of yarn. When first strand is done, connect the next strand to it, secure the connection with electrical tape and continue winding. Leave about 12" of cord free at the end.



Voila! You have completed your first light globe and it's ready to go. Repeat for as many globes as you want and plug 3-4 globes together via a three-pronged adapter, again—securing all connections with electrical or duct tape. Do test the lights before hanging. Enjoy!
